

03 TO REMEMBER

Sexual violence

- X Not all sexual violence is physical.
- **X** There is no hierarchy in sexual violence. They are all unacceptable.
- **X** Sexual violence can take place within intimate relationships.

Sexual consent

Must be :

Clear: verbal or non-verbal

Free: by the person themselves, free from threat / pressure / blackmail

Informed: knowing the modalities, without intoxication

Verified: regularly

Enthusiastic: wanting and expressing pleasure

Revocable: at any time

Age of sexual consent is 16

- X Exception for 12 or 13 year olds : Age difference of maximum 2 years minus 1 day
- X Exception for 14 or 15 year olds : Age difference of maximum 5 years minus 1 day
- X Under no circumstances may there be a relationship of authority, dependence and exploitation.

Other information

X The consent of two intoxicated persons is not valid.



06 TO REMEMBER

Victim blaming

- **X** Blaming the victim is a way to protect oneself from one's own vulnerability.
- X It has a negative impact on the disclosure of sexual violence.

Seduction

- **X** Respect, reciprocity and consent are three key words in seduction.
- **X** Focus on personality rather than appearance.

Intervention :

X In the intervention, it is important to reprimand sexual violence behavior rather than non-protective behavior

Intervention :

X Seduction is positive and pleasant. Teens are interested in the pleasure of sexuality. Therefore, sexual education should be positive.





08 TO REMEMBER

Receiving a disclosure :

- $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{X}}$ The disclosure process can be difficult, and take a different form from one person to another.
- **X** Focus on the emotions rather than the situation.

Key Elements in Responding to a sexual violence disclosure

- X A word of welcome
- X Validate emotions
- X Identify needs
- **X** Refer to the right resources
- $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{X}}$ Present and identify yourself as a welcoming, caring and inclusive person.
- **X** Present and identify yourself as a person who does not tolerate sexual violence.

Obligations to report to the Director of Youth Protection (DYP) - counsellors and professionals.

- **X** Sexual abuse
- X Sexual relationship between 2 teens where one is under the age of consent = sexual assault = reporting
- X Sexual violence on social media

Call the DYP, even when in doubt (24 hours a day, 7 days a week)

- X Identifying information (e.g., name, address, age).
- **X** Facts that concern you.
- If you have questions and are not ready to report,
 you can always consult with them first.
